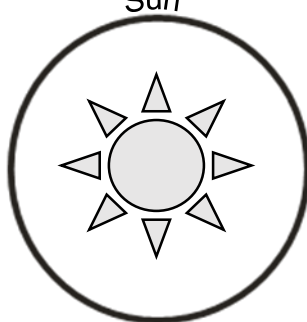
## FOOD WEB: WHAT IS ON THE MENU?

With the following organisms, create a food web by drawing arrows from predator to prey or energy source to show the movement of matter throughout the ecosystem.

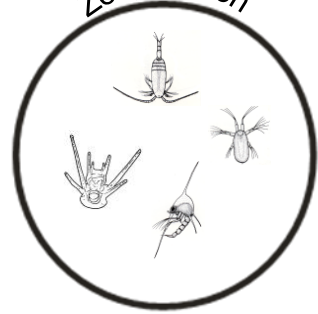
